Message from the President Couple

ovember is going to be a busy month. Our big dance this month will be the **Get Acquainted Dance** on Saturday Nov 15th, where we introduce all of our new dancers and learn a little bit about them. The C & D Fill the Hall program will kick off with the **Movember Dance** hosted by the Rockyview Ramblers on Friday Nov 14th. There will be other dances in November - check out the attached Visitation schedule.

You might be wondering what the cover image is all about. Firstly, the style is called Retro Print. Retro prints refer to a design style that mimics the look and feel of mid-2oth-century printed graphics, often characterized by:

- Halftone dots: Small dots used to create shading and gradients, a hallmark of older printing methods.
- Limited color palettes: Typically bold, flat colors with noticeable separation.
- Textured imperfections: Slight misalignments or ink bleed that evoke vintage printing processes.

Where did they originate? Retro print aesthetics draw inspiration from both newspaper printing and comic book printing, but their strongest association is with comic book printing of the 1940s–1960s. Newspaper printing introduced halftone technology for photographs and illustrations, but the style was utilitarian and monochrome. Comic books popularized vibrant halftone patterns and exaggerated color separations, which became iconic in pop art and retro design. So, while the technical roots lie in newspaper halftone printing, the visual identity of "retro print" as a design style comes primarily from comic book printing.

But what about the content of the image? These are drawn from events taking place in November: Remembrance Day (Nov 11), Leonid and other meteor showers, the Moon – Saturn Conjunction (Nov 2), Comet C/2025/R2 (SWAN), Comet C/2025 A6 (LEMMON), Day of the Dead (Mexico, Nov 1), Daylight Saving Time to Standard Time Change (Nov 2), and the US National Square Dancing Day (Nov 29).


